CHURCH ADDS NEW STAFF MEMBER

Dr. Lexi White

First Ever IT Facilitator

Upon the recommendation of the Session’s Personnel and Administration Committee, the Session voted unanimously to add Dr. Lexi White to the Third Presbyterian Church Staff as its first ever IT Facilitator.

Since March 2020, when the church added a virtual worship service, Lexi, has been critical to the success of the service. She first joined Third Presbyterian when she lived in Norfolk. She is now a virtual church member and lives on Long Island, New York, where she continues to be actively involved in the church’s life.

The Session realized in 2021 the congregation needed to add a part-time person to help us with our Live-Stream Worship Service and our Social-Media platforms. Lexi was volunteering hours and hours every week to help the church with the Live Stream Worship and its Social Media platforms. At the same time, these areas were among the fastest growing ones in the church!

We are thrilled Lexi has agreed to take on this new part-time position. Lexi is now a virtual church member and a virtual staff member! If you would like to thank her and congratulate her too you can email her at alexis.white.me@gmail.com.

I met with the pastor at the time, Pastor Gini, and spent several hours talking with her about life and church. She welcomed every question I had with no judgment and was full of support. Team Third truly helped me through my time in graduate school and continues to help even though now I'm several states away!

4) What do you like the best about Third Presbyterian?

I like that Third Presbyterian cares. Often in life we get too wrapped up in the details or logistics. But from the mini food pantry, library, clothes closet, asking people to let folks know when they need help during announcements each week, it is clear Team Third cares. Third Presbyterian is a church for the community even when the pandemic surges they find ways to make a difference and I appreciate that. I appreciate just how many individuals in the church take the time to make you smile. I'm thankful for the kindness.

5) Are you excited to be the church's first IT Facilitator?

Yes! I'm excited to work with everyone in Team Third to continue to improve our worship services, and our internet presence. By being on the staff, I can dedicate time to training and continue to support as an official IT Facilitator. Although I'm generally hiding behind a box on zoom, I want everyone to know that I miss you all dearly and hope you are staying safe and warm this winter! Thank you for this opportunity!

Third Pres Prayer Team

Starting in March

In the Bible, we are told to pray over and over. We are told God hears and honors our prayers. The Psalmist said, “I prayed to the LORD, and he answered me.” Like a good parent, our Heavenly Father listens to our concerns and assures He will take care of us.

“The prayers of a good person are powerful.”

James 5:16

Third Presbyterian believes in the Power of Prayer.

The book of James said the prayer of a Godly person has a powerful effect. Think explosive. Think potent.

Third Presbyterian is forming a Prayer Team. As-a-matter-of-fact, the new church Prayer Team could be nicknamed the “*Power Lifters*,” because they will be lifting up things to the God who has the power to change them!



What will this new Prayer Team do?

- 1) They will pray for you and your concerns.** You will soon find a Prayer Request Form on the church webpage and in the bulletin where you can make a prayer request. Or if you prefer, you can send your prayer requests directly to the church office. Each prayer request will be remembered for 30-days. You can also ask the Prayer Team to renew your request as many times as you would like.
- 2) They will pray for every Worship Service.** They will ask God to help people get to the service. They will pray that the worship team is focused and gives God glory. They will pray that everyone who watches the service is drawn closer to the Lord Jesus.
- 3) They will pray for the church staff.** Our church staff includes Debbie, our church secretary, Lexi, our IT Facilitator, Joseph, our Choir Director, Clara, our Sexton or Housekeeper, and Pastor Larry. They will ask the Lord to protect them, energize them, and use them to build up the Kingdom of God.

- 4) **They will pray the Harvest Prayer.** The only prayer Jesus specifically told His followers to pray was this prayer from Matthew 9, “Father, give us more workers to go into the fields that are white unto harvest.”

Each prayer request will be treated with the upmost care. You will have the option of sharing your prayer request with Pastor Larry or you may share your prayer request with the Prayer Team, which includes Pastor Larry, or you may share your prayer request with the Prayer Team and the congregation. The Prayer Team will also maintain a Prayer Book. Each Prayer Request will be noted in the Prayer Book along with the date the request was made. And when a prayer request is answered in some way, it will also be noted so that we can see how God is moving among us and thank Him for answering our prayer.
